The scholarships are awarded without consideration of financial need. The scholarships are awarded to incoming freshman whose scholarship, attendance, behavior and community service is <u>far above standard</u>. Scholarships will be awarded as follows: One scholarship of \$1000.00 payable directly to the school in two payments (usually in September and January). Two one time scholarships of \$500.00 will be awarded to the second and third place students.

'A Classic Irish Christmas,' Dec. 7, 2007

'Msgr. John's Knights' (Msgr. John C. Seidenschwang Council) will hold its Third Annual Andy Cooney 'Classic Irish Christmas ' Concert at 8 P.M. on Friday, December 7 in St. Anne's McCloskey Auditorium, Dartmouth St. & New Hyde Park Road, Garden City. Tickets at \$25 each may be ordered by phone (352-2457). Profits from the concert will help support Council's charities including scholarship grants to students attending Catholic high schools.

McCloskey auditorium has become 'Cooney Country!' with overflow crowds (600 to 750) on hand to meet 'Irish America's favorite son.' And, no wonder. There's a sense of pride in the fact that Cooney got his start on stage here in the mid-1980's with famed Irish musician and entertainer, Paddy Noonan's band.

Co-starring with Cooney and his brilliant band of master Irish and American musicians will be comedian George Casey, Ireland's new 'King of Blarney'; Odette Woods, soprano (opera, Irish ballads, Christmas carols) and Dublin's Traditional Irish Dancers.

Since concert is on December 7 (Pearl Harbor Day) Knights will honor all living WWII vets in the 17th Nassau KC/District by posting their names on an 'Honor Roll' at the concert and in the Playbill-like concert program. Knights will conduct drawing from the names and award winner a valuable 6-disc set of all the TV episodes of the widely-hailed Ken Burns/PBS-TV special 'The War' plus a companion WWII book guide. Winner does not have to be present for drawing.
